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Statement on 2024 – 2025 State Budget Agreement

Hauppauge, NY (January 17, 2024): The Executive Budget acknowledges the worsening financial condition of New York's hospitals but offers funding cuts, not solutions.

The Suburban Hospital Alliance joins its association colleagues in the call on state government leaders to close the gap between Medicaid rates and the cost of providing that care. The state must make a state multi-year investment so that the essential safety that provides coverage to nearly 40 percent of New Yorkers actually reimburses providers what it costs to treat patients.

Instead, Governor Hochul proposed no adjustment to keep with inflation and rising workforce costs, a cut to a component of the Medicaid hospital rate, and reduced support for struggling safety net institutions and capital projects. Additional provisions that expand Medicaid benefits and increase enrollment in Medicaid and the Essential Plan are laudable but, so long as the state does not pay the full cost of caring for Medicaid patients, these policies further burden stressed providers.

Every day, hospital leaders must figure out how to afford rising labor rates, temporary staffing costs, outrageous drug prices, and manage other inflationary pressures while meeting the needs of their communities. At minimum, Medicaid rates must keep up or patient access is at risk.
